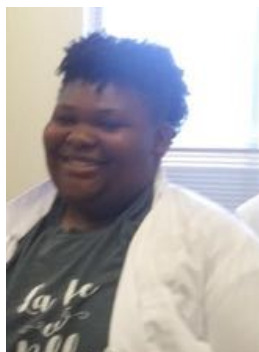

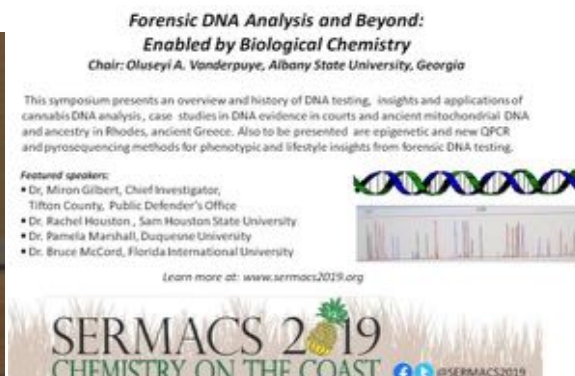

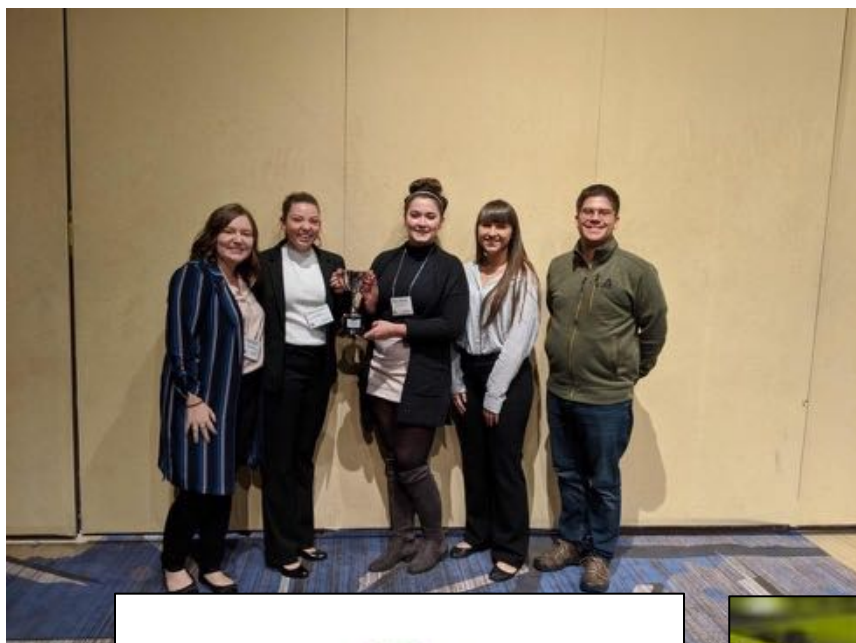

Happy 2020, everyone! Our Sun Devil DDE chapter started off a little slow in the beginning, but we've been making up for it this academic year.

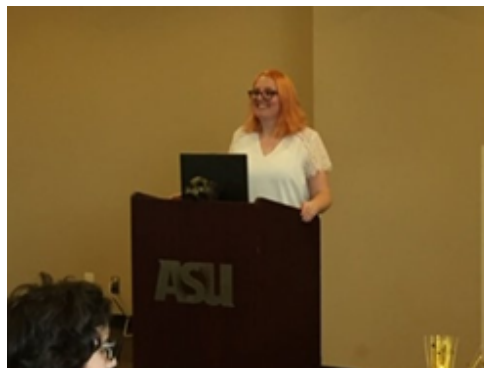

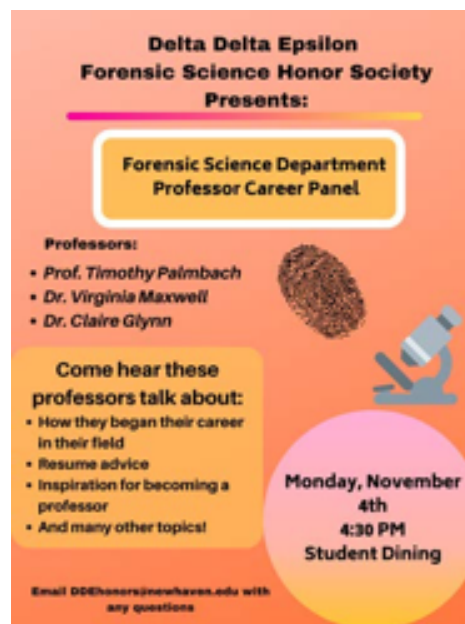
Fall 2019 Events:

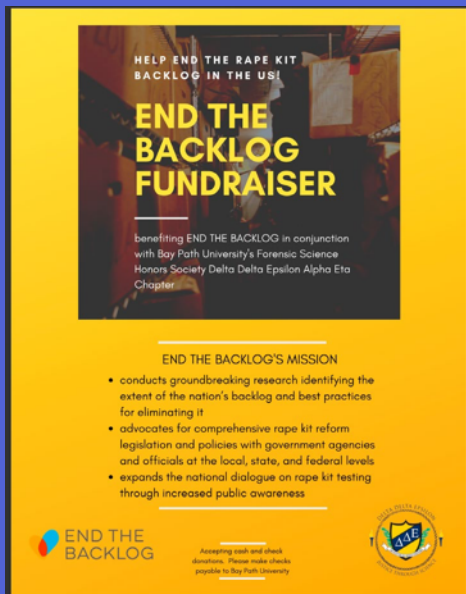

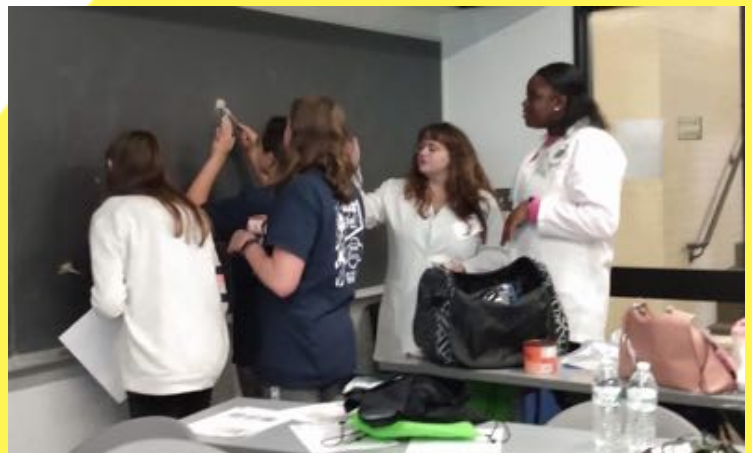

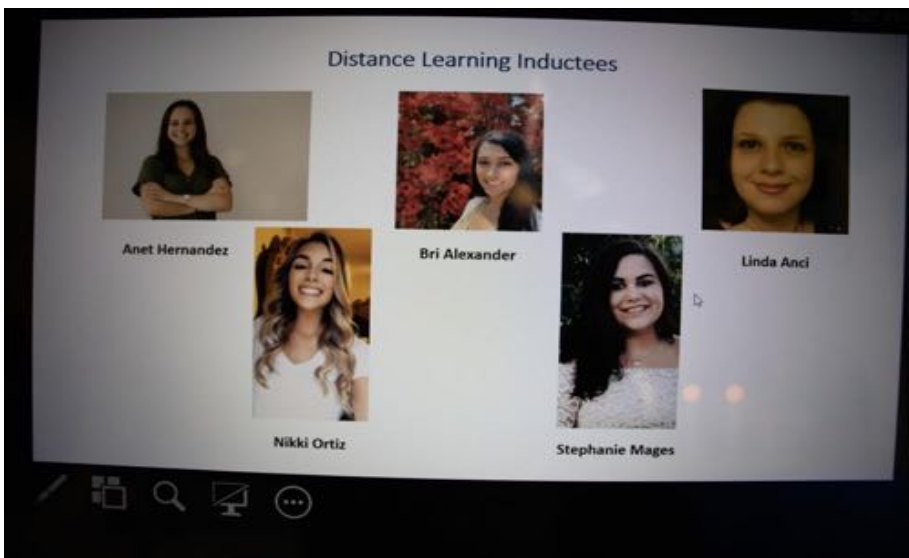


Alpha-Kappa Chapter 2019 Overview
