

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Journal of Forensic Science Education




The Epsilon Chapter was founded in 2012 and nearly 90 undergraduate and graduate forensic science students from Cedar Crest College have been inducted. Graduate students are eligible after their first semester of academic work and must have a minimum GPA of 3.5. Undergraduates are eligible after 75 credits and must have an overall GPA of at least 3.3. On April 29, 2022, the Epsilon Chapter welcomed 10 new members in the Chapter's annual induction ceremony.

The Chapter holds at least one outreach event each year. In April of 2022, the Epsilon Chapter performed an outreach event at Trexler Middle School in Allentown, PA. This event was aimed at students in grades 6-8 who are interested in learning more about STEM programs. During this event, members of DDE set up a crime scene and various stations where evidence was processed and analyzed. Middle school students learned about bloodstain pattern analysis, microscopic hair analysis, footwear impressions, fingerprint analysis, and DNA profiling. The students used all these tools to create a report for what they believed happened. In the end the students were able to see if their investigative skills were correct as there was a video depicting what happened.

Members of the Epsilon Chapter also contribute to the success of forensic science program events at Cedar Crest College. In March of 2022 members of DDE volunteered at the 20th Annual Forensic Science Symposium at Cedar Crest College in Allentown, PA. Members helped with registration as well as the distribution of food and beverages. This event was created in part to help develop interest in forensic science in high school students and community members by having presentations from forensic science professionals as well as other users of the profession.

The Epsilon Chapter is looking forward to the next academic year with more events and is always mindful of "Justice through Science".


